Scleroderma is a chronic, autoimmune connective tissue disease, which means that it is a condition in which the body's immune system attacks its own tissues. There are two basic forms of scleroderma: systemic that usually affects the internal organs or internal systems of the body as well as the skin, and localized that affects a local area of skin either in patches or in a line down an arm or leg, or as a line down the forehead. Scleroderma the name means "hard skin" can vary a great deal in severity. Although there are medications to slow down the disease progression and help with symptoms, there is as yet no cure for scleroderma.
